**NO known breeding required to enter these classes** TGCA Breed classes are qualifiers for the Best of Breed

Finals at the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association's (TGCA) National Breed Championship Show "TOYS".  
Classes are open to all traditional gypsy cobs.

**Part Bred** classes, are open to all part bred traditional gypsy cobs and are qualifiers for the part bred finals at "TOYS". The exhibit must have one parent that is traditional gypsy cob.

**Stallions – All stallions** (4 years and over) in order to enter any TGCA affiliated class **MUST** be TGCA registered, have passed TGCA stallion evaluations and their TGCA stallion disc displayed on their bridle. Stallions and colts over the age of two, **MUST** be shown in a stallion bridle with a metal bit and chain lead as per the current TGCA rulebook.

Current TGCA members must present their Membership card and Qualification card to the judge in the ring for signature.

Non-members **MUST** receive a qualification card from the judge and have **21 days to join the TGCA and register their horse to validate the qualification**. Semi- final places will be awarded to 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place unless already qualified.

**CLASS 6 - BSHA RISING STAR LIHS SMALL RIDING HORSE –Mare or gelding**, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148 cm but not exceeding 158cm the winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star small riding horse supreme final at the LIHS in December. If already qualified the qualification will move down no further than third place. Semi- final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

**CLASS65 7- BSHA RISING STAR LIHS LARGE RIDING HORSE - Mare or gelding**, 4 years old and over, exceeding158 cm. The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star large Riding Horse Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

**CLASS 8 - BSHA RISING STAR LIHS HACK - Mare or gelding**, 4 years old and over, exceeding148 cm, but not exceeding 160 cm. The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Hack Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

**CLASS 9 - BSHA RISING STAR LIHS RACEHORSE TO SHOW HORSE - Mare or gelding**, 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cm. Open to thoroughbred horses retired from race training. The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Racehorse to Show Horse Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified This class is open to competitors who work within the racing industry.

**CLASS 10-- BSHA RISING STAR LIHS LADIES SHOW HORSE /SIDE SADDLE - Mare or gelding**, 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cms, suitable to carry a side saddle, to be ridden by a lady. Open to all Hacks, Cobs, Riding Horses and Hunters. The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Ladies Show Horse Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. ## WORKING HORSE & PONY

HORSE OR PONY, STALLION, MARE OR GELDING.FOUR YEARS AND OVER, RIDER ANY AGE. STALLIONS MAY ONLY BE RIDDEN BY COMPETITORS 12 YEARS AND OVER AND SUITABLY MOUNTED.

THESE CLASSES ARE DESIGNED TO ENCOURAGE THE HORSE OR PONY AND COMPETITOR TO PERFORM STYLISHLY.

#### METHOD OF JUDGING

- 1.The horse or pony will enter the ring individually and jump a course of obstacles designed to produce a maximum of ten jumping efforts. Course builders are recommended to avoid fences with a related distance.
2. Each jumping effort will be marked out of ten at the judge's discretion.
- 3.There is no set penalty for a pole down or a run out, but three refusals will result in elimination. 4.Fall of horse or rider will result in elimination.
- 5.There will be no mark awarded for conformation or manners, but a mark will be awarded for overall impression at the completion of each round.
- 6.The judge may ask competitors to walk trot & canter as a group but there will be no individual performance.

**CLASS 11 – WORKING HORSE or PONY** maximum height of fences 60cm (2ft)

**CLASS 12 – WORKING HORSE or PONY** Maximum height of fences 65cm (2'3)

**CLASS 13 - WORKING HORSE or PONY** Maximum height of fences 76cm (2'6)

**CLASS 14 – WORKING HORSE or PONY** Maximum height of fences 84cm (2'9)

**CLASS 15 – WORKING HORSE or PONY** Maximum height of fences 92cm (3ft)

be given to the qualifying combination at each show, this may not always be  
the winner; if the winner has already qualified, they may be paced down to 4<sup>th</sup>

combinations are required to become full members of the SSA 21 days prior to the National Side Saddle Show.

**37 – SIDE SADDLE CONCOURS D' ELEGANCE –** The sole criterion for this class is the elegance of the picture provided by the horse and rider. Attention may be paid to the rider's personal appearance, but detailed inspection of rider or tack.

**Judge - Ms Amber Thorpe – Suffolk**

**This show is associated to the British Show Pony Association and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in BSPS classes (wether members or not members of the BSPS) are subject to the rules of the BSPS, including the disciplinary procedures and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the BSPS.**

**This show is a qualifier for the London International Horse Show. Only one pony in each of the following classes will qualify and the highest placed (not**

**already qualified) from the first five ponies placed in class will qualify. Non - members of the BSPS have seven days to complete their registration and membership to keep the qualification otherwise it will pass to the next exhibitor.**

**The BSPS coloured performance classes are open to mares, geldings and CHAPS (UK) or BSPA graded stallions, 4 years old or over to be registered in and complying with the showing requirements of the main body of the stud book of CHAPS(UK) or the BSPA. Ponies can be registered with either of these societies or the BSPS and owners and riders must be or become members within 7 days to take the qualification.**

**Class 38– BSPS HERITAGE LEAD REIN WORKING SPORTS PONY, Mare or gelding, 4 years and over, Mountain & Moorland registered. Ponies not exceeding 128cm. Ridden by a child to have attained their 5<sup>th</sup> birthday on the 1<sup>st</sup> of January in the current year and not to have attained their 10<sup>th</sup> birthday on the 1<sup>st</sup> of January in the current year. Any suitable bridle.**

**Criteria – The leader must be 16 years or over and may only lead one pony in a class. The reins must go directly to the child's hands with no attachments to or on to the saddle. Handles on saddles are permitted but the reins must not be attached to the handle or to the saddle The lead rein must be affixed to the noseband on which it must remain while the pony is in the ring. Whilst in the ring ponies must always be led by the leader. The leader should be on the near side with the lead rein in the left hand.**

**RIDERS – Hats in accordance with BSPS rules, tweed jacket, beige or cream jodhpurs, shirt, tie, gloves and boots. No buttonholes.**

**LEADERS – Country attire, Gentlemen Trilby hats or caps, Ladies modest hats.**

**Method of judging- Ponies will enter the ring at a walk, they may be trotted together at the judge's discretion. They will be pulled into line and ask to perform an individual test around obstacles including jumping a maximum of 3 small upright fences not exceeding 30cm. No spread fences. Water will not be included. Ponies will not be asked to walk on artificial material e.g plastic sheeting during the test. Riders will not**

be asked to dismount. Judges will penalise refusals, knockdowns or taking the wrong course. A stride or two of canter over the fences will not be penalised. There will be no conformation marks. **PONIES MUST BE SHOWN UN-PLAITED AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH THEIR BREED STANDARD,**

**CLASS 39 - BSPS HERITAGE FIRST RIDDEN WORKING SPORTS PONY, Mare or gelding 4 years and over. For registered and non-registered Mountain & Moorland type ponies not exceeding 128cm. Ridden by a child to have attained their 6<sup>th</sup> birthday on the 1<sup>st</sup> of January in the current year and not to have attained their 12<sup>th</sup> birthday on the 1<sup>st</sup> of January in the current year. Ponies to be shown un-plaited. Any suitable bridle. In First Ridden WSP classes the judges will be looking for a pony suitable for a child to begin their future career in working sports pony classes. Ponies to be shown un-plaited.**

**MARKS; manners and style whilst performing the test (including jumping) 60 MARKS.**

**Type, movement and way of going 20 MARKS.**

**Presentation and suitability of pony for the child 20 MARKS**

**CRITERIA -Martingales are permitted.**

**RIDERS HATS in in accordance with BSPS rules. Tweed jackets, beige or cream jodhpurs, shirt, tie, boots and gloves. Body protectors are compulsory in this class.**

#### **METHOD OF JUDGING**

**Ponies will enter the ring at a walk and then trotted altogether at the judge's discretion. They will be pulled into line in any order and ask to perform an individual test around obstacles including jumping a maximum of 3 fences not exceeding 30cm. At the end of the test, they will canter down one side of the arena to finish. No spread fences, water will not be included. Ponies will not be asked to walk on any artificial material e.g plastic sheeting during the test.**

**Riders will not be asked to dismount.**

**Judges will penalise knock downs, refusals and taking the wrong course.**

**Cantering over the fences will not be penalised.**

**There will be NO conformation marks.**

CLASS 40 – **BSPS PERFORMANCE PONY**, Mare or gelding, 4 years and over, not exceeding 148cm. Plaited ponies. Riders not to have attained their 17<sup>th</sup> birthday on the 1<sup>st</sup> of January in the current year.

Class 41- **BSPS PERFORMANCE PONY**, Mare or gelding 4 years and over, not exceeding 158cm, plaited ponies/ horses. Riders any age

Class 42 – **BSPS JUNIOR PERFORMANCE PONY**, mare or gelding 4 years and over not exceeding 128cm. Plaited ponies. Riders not to have attained their 12<sup>th</sup> birthday on the 1<sup>st</sup> of January in the current year. Any suitable bridle.No cantering except in individual performance.

CLASS 43 – **BSPS PERFORMANCE COLOURED NATIVE / COB / TRADITIONAL HORSE/ PONY CLASS**, Graded stallion,,mare or gelding ,4 years and over. Rider any age.

Class 44 -**BSPS PERFORMANCE COLOURED NON - NATIVE HORSE/ PONY**

**CLASS**, Graded stallion, mare or gelding ,4 years and over, rider any age, plaited.

**METHOD OF JUDGING** – Exhibitors will go round the ring as whole group, (no pull in). They will undertake a display (rather than a show), where they will need to show certain, movements which will include walk, including a walk on a free rein, trot, canter on both reins, a canter circle, canter transition on the straight, extension in canter on one rein and a halt. Competitors in these classes will not be stripped.

**Marks** - Performance,60 marks. Presentation and suitability of horse for rider,20 marks.Type, movement and way of going 20 marks.

1. All entries must be made on the official entry forms and accompanied by the entry fees. Entries close on **Friday the 21<sup>st</sup> of June 2024** Exhibitors Numbers will be despatched before the Show.

2. All stock exhibited shall be the bona-fide property of the Exhibitor, or the exhibitor should have the written consent of the owner, at the time making the entry and at the time of showing. No substitution of entries, nor transfers between classes, will be allowed.

3. All Cars must park in the public car parks which are free of charge

4. Anybody riding a horse or pony at the Show must wear a hat approved by their governing body. Riding is only permitted on the routes to and from the Rings, in the Rings or Horse Lines, practice area and warm up ring. **Horses found outside these areas will be disqualified.**

5. Any objection to any award or prize must be made IN WRITING TO THE SECRETARY WITHIN 30 MINUTES AFTER THE JUDGING OF THE CLASS CONCERNED has ended on the Show Day, accompanied by a deposit of **£50**. If after enquiry the protest is considered frivolous such deposit may be forfeited. The complaint may not be dealt with on Show Day.

6. (a) Lawford Park Horse Show, its officers, servants, agents and employees will not be responsible for or accountable to any person whatsoever for any damage or loss, however caused, to the property of any such person, that may occur whilst upon the Showground or Car Parks or whilst entering or leaving the same.

(b) Lawford Park Horse Show, its officers, servants, agents and employees will not be responsible under any circumstances whatsoever for any accident loss or damage, however caused, that may occur to, or be caused by any person or to or by any animal, article, vehicle or equipment exhibited or brought onto the Show ground or Car Parks. 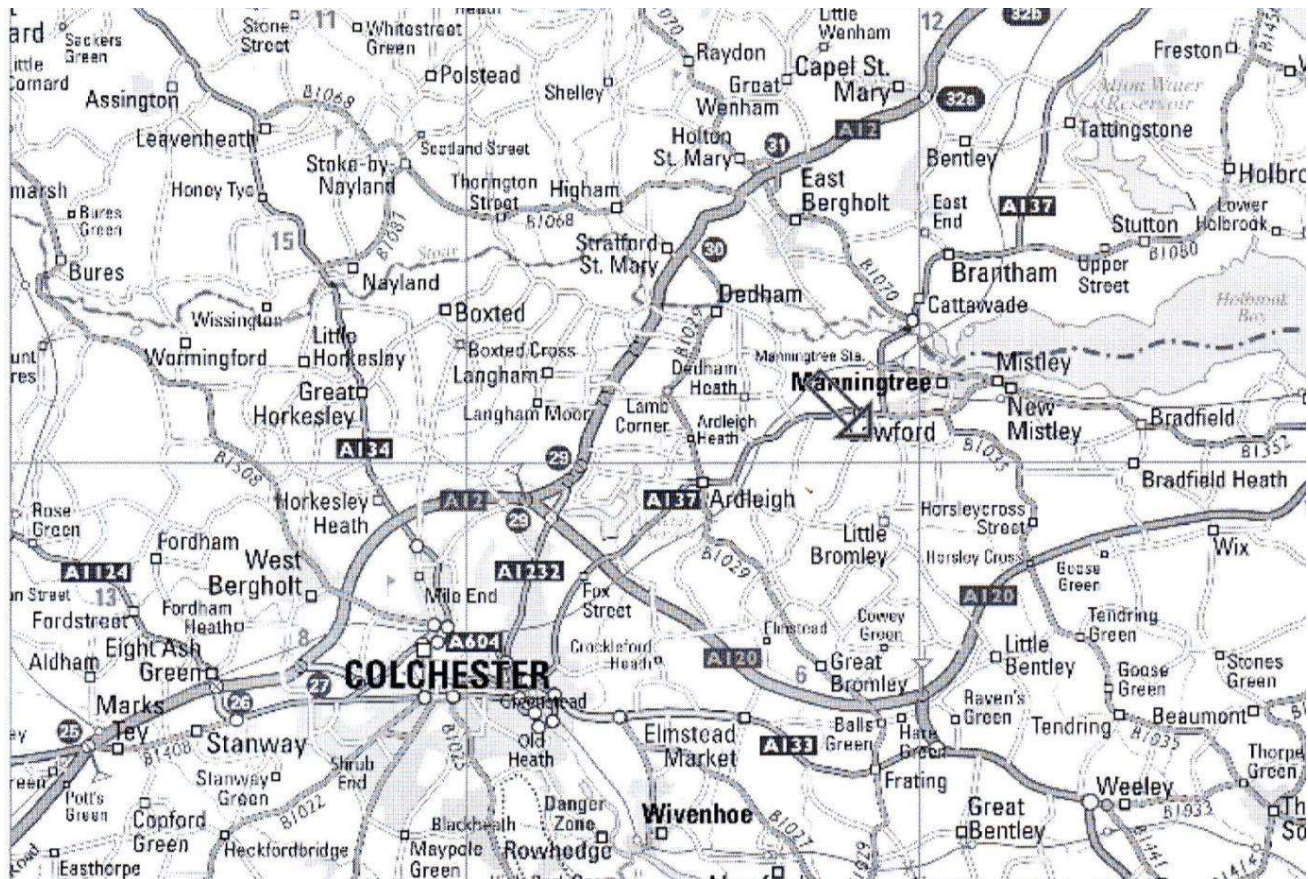
